A Decade of Strengthening Environmental Education

In 2014, a diverse group of educators and environmental agencies from across the globe convened in Taiwan to address a crucial question: How can we strengthen environmental education programs globally? This initial gathering, which included representatives from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA), Taiwan's Environmental Protection Agency (now the Ministry of Environment), the North American Association for Environmental Education (NAAEE), National Wildlife Federation (NWF), and educators from five continents, sowed the seeds for creating a global learning network. Those initial spirited discussions, follow-up surveys, and meetings evolved into a dynamic learning network that we now call the Global Environmental Education Partnership, or the GEEP. The GEEP is designed to bolster global efforts in environmental education, share effective practices, and ignite innovative solutions to the pressing environmental and social challenges we face—all through the transformative power of education.

This brief report highlights our achievements over the past decade and sets the table for an ambitious future agenda. At its core, GEEP serves as an idea incubator, a collaborative learning platform, and a showcase for effective environmental initiatives worldwide. Built on principles of more collaboration and sharing and less bureaucracy and competition, GEEP provides a space for developing new ideas and supporting partnerships and networks working in all aspects of education and sustainability. The network's strength lies in its talented advisors and contributors who work tirelessly across the globe to engage, inspire, educate, and connect people from diverse sectors, disciplines, and organizations.

The GEEP would not have been possible without the incredible leadership and support of Taiwan's Ministry of Environment (MOENV), U.S. EPA, NAAEE, and the dedicated leaders who serve on the GEEP Advisory Group.



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Overview of the GEEP

Since its inception, the Global Environmental Education Partnership (GEEP) has pursued a bold vision: harnessing the transformative power of education to build a more sustainable and just world. We believe education is a catalyst for meaningful change, helping individuals and communities thrive in harmony with nature while addressing the urgent environmental and social challenges of our time. Through a dynamic and inclusive global learning network, GEEP strengthens environmental education (EE) capacity in countries across the globe and works together with key advisors and partners, including Taiwan's Ministry of Environment, U.S. EPA, NAAEE, the GEEP Advisory Group, our regional hubs in the Asia Pacific and Africa, and thought leaders and educators worldwide. This report highlights our key initiatives and the progress we've made so far.

In 2024, GEEP Advisors approved an updated GEEP Strategic Plan that focuses on the following vision, mission, and goals:

Vision

We seek to use the power of education to create a sustainable and just future where people and nature thrive, and where environmental and social responsibility drive individual, community, and institutional choices.

Mission

GEEP's mission is to create a vibrant and inclusive learning network designed to build capacity in countries around the world to strengthen environmental education (EE), leading to a more sustainable future.

Goals

- To connect and build bridges among practitioners, researchers, policymakers, institutions, providers, and international networks to elevate effective practice, scale impact, share global resources, and catalyze collaboration
- To demonstrate the value and impact of EE as a tool for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- To support, mentor, and empower a new generation of innovative and inspirational leaders to shape the future
- 4 To promote innovation through a Global EE Think Tank

GEEP Programs and Activities

Since its start in 2014, the GEEP has supported programs and activities—in person and online—designed to build capacity in countries around the world to strengthen environmental education. GEEP convenes, builds leadership, collaborates with others, promotes effective practices, and explores new ideas. We've also created and highlighted resources to strengthen our work around the world.

Here's a sample of the initiatives that have been supported by the GEEP in the past decade.

Building and Strengthening Networks

Convening Thought Leaders (In Person and Online)

Asia Pacific Virtual Environmental Education Forum (APF)

In 2021, GEEP hosted the Asia Pacific Virtual Environmental Education Forum to build capacity on key EE topics throughout the Asia Pacific region and facilitate connections among attendees to help strengthen regional networks. This three-day forum included 18 inspiring plenary and concurrent sessions and featured 57 EE leaders from across the region and the United States, creating space for participants to dive deeper into specific topics related to their work. The Forum was hosted on a virtual event platform that allowed for easy access to all sessions, including recordings of all sessions accessible for six months, networking opportunities with fellow attendees, and real-time translation into more than 100 languages for the Forum's live plenaries.

The Forum attracted **550 attendees** from 68 countries and provided significant momentum for GEEP to further explore partnerships within Taiwan and beyond, including with governments, NGOs, and the private sector, to expand GEEP and Taiwan's impact on global capacity for EE. From our post-forum evaluation, all respondents were either very satisfied (67%) or satisfied (33%) with their experience. In addition, 94% of respondents said the APF met their expectations. A majority of respondents reported that the Forum helped them meet professional and educational goals, including: learning about effective EE practice and resources, understanding how EE can help address key environmental and social issues in the region, gaining the knowledge and connections to build stronger regional and country-level networks, and identifying opportunities for collaboration in the region to address the SDGs.



Webinars and Virtual Workshops



Each year the GEEP convenes its Advisory Group, bringing thought leaders from around the world together to advance EE as a tool to achieve environmental and social outcomes. These gatherings provide a space to reflect on what we have accomplished and strategize how we can continue to have impact and advance our goals. GEEP Advisors also present at various events around the world, including international gatherings, such as the World **Environmental Education Congress** (WEEC), the Climate COP, and other conferences and gatherings. In addition, GEEP Advisors have met annually at the NAAEE International Conference since 2015.



In 2021, the GEEP hosted an event in conjunction with COP26 in Glasgow, Scotland, to highlight GEEP's ongoing programs as well as the emerging work of GEEP Africa.








In 2021, with the presentation at COP 26, a group of leaders in Africa, led by long-time GEEP Advisory Group member, Mphemelang (MJ) Ketlhoilwe, launched the GEEP Africa hub. Since then, the GEEP Africa planning team has continued to develop a strategy and structure for a regional network in Africa. In 2022, the GEEP facilitated discussions between GEEP APRC and the emerging GEEP Africa hub to share learning and insights. GEEP Africa developed their first draft strategy in late 2022 and have offered webinars and support across the continent. GEEP Global will continue to provide support to the two existing regional hubs, as well as other regions that might want to collaborate and focus on EE within regional contexts.

Supporting the Next Generation of EE Champions

Supports GEEP Goal 3

At the heart of GEEP's mission lies a commitment to nurturing the next generation of environmental leaders. Our suite of leadership programs, developed in collaboration with key partners, serves as a launchpad for young professionals eager to make their mark in the field of environmental education, conservation, and other related fields.

These programs are designed to:

- Shine a spotlight on emerging talent, giving recognition to innovative work and fresh ideas
- Provide crucial funding opportunities to turn visionary projects into reality
- Foster a vibrant, global network of young professionals
- Accelerate career growth through targeted skill-building and resumeenhancing experiences
- Create exclusive platforms for connecting with established leaders and newcomers in environmental education

By participating in these programs, young professionals become part of a global movement shaping the future of environmental education and sustainability.

EE 30 Under 30

Supports GEEP Goal 3

This program shines the spotlight on thirty changemakers each year who demonstrate passion, commitment, and leadership using EE. Each class of EE 30 Under 30 receives global recognition, joins a growing community of inspiring EE leaders, and has access to ongoing opportunities for professional development and networking. Awardees include social entrepreneurs, artists, journalists, researchers, activists, educators, and more.



- Pilot Country-Level Initiatives: In 2022, our GEEP partners in Northern Ireland replicated the EE 30 Under 30 program and created their own country-wide competition, adapting the program to meet their own needs and context. GEEP Global worked with the team to use the same application platform and learn from the lessons of the global search. This pilot was led and funded by Keep Northern Ireland Beautiful (KNIB) and was an example of successfully replicating and adapting this global program to the country level. They launched their second year of the program in 2024.
- Sharing Stories: NAAEE uses its social media community to share about the accomplishments of EE 30 Under 30 awardees and alumni from previous years across Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, and YouTube. In 2023 and 2024 these posts were seen over 87,000 times and received over 6,700 likes, comments, and shares. These statistics show how impactful the EE 30 Under 30 program can be for its awardees, helping them expand their networks and promote their work on a global stage.


- Professional Development and Networking: The GEEP continues to offer networking opportunities and ongoing support to EE 30 Under 30 awardees and alumni.
 - NAAEE and the GEEP provide opportunities for awardees and alumni to present at webinars and conferences.
 - The GEEP shares resources and opportunities with all alumni on a regular basis through an email listserv and WhatsApp group, where NAAEE staff and alumni share funding opportunities, webinars, fellowships, and more.
 - In 2019, the GEEP launched a peer-mentoring program for awardees.
 - The GEEP annually sponsors EE 30 Under 30 awardees as plenary speakers and discussion panelists at the NAAEE Conference, featuring awardees from across 6 continents. Livestreamed events have attracted more than 800 views.
 - This event was also livestreamed on Facebook, attracting 884 views.
 - The GEEP, by leveraging its partnership with Wells Fargo launched the EE 30 Under 30 Changemaker Grants program, giving alumni the opportunity to apply for small grants to support their work, accompanied by ongoing support and training as they implement their grant projects.
 - In 2023, EE 30 Under 30 hosted a Spanish-only session at NAAEE's annual conference.

Since 2016, NAAEE's EE 30 Under 30 program has recognized 271 individuals (one year we selected 31) from 53 countries who are making a difference through environmental education. On average, their collective work reaches more than 360,000 people each year, many of whom are on the frontlines of the climate and biodiversity crises. In total, NAAEE and the GEEP have worked together to provide more than \$200,000 in project support to these young leaders.

Youth Innovation Challenge (YIC)

Supports GEEP Goal 3

With support from the Taiwan Ocean Conservation Administration (OCA), GEEP has implemented an annual Youth Innovation Challenge since 2021, which invites young people between the ages of 15–30 from around the world to submit innovative solutions, using EE, to advance marine conservation. Each year, we recognize 12 finalists and 3 winners. Awardee highlights on the YIC webpages and social media have received nearly 36,000 views from 170 countries!


Since YIC's launch in 2021, GEEP has awarded 14 YIC winners and 48 finalists from 28 countries. Winners receive a \$1,000 USD prize to support their solution. The 2024 YIC expanded the program's focus of protecting marine resources by addressing issues of conservation, biodiversity, and marine debris, and supporting people of all ages to be engaged stewards for marine environments. Our 2024 YIC winners attended an award ceremony and presented their solutions at the first International Conference on Marine Debris in Taipei, Taiwan, hosted by Taiwan OCA in September 2024.

CALL FOR ACTION

As environmental educators, we know that what we do informs, inspires, and enlightens. It builds human capacity, provokes questions, enhances skills and sapes values and attitudes. It galvanizes individuals, families and communities to make informed decisions about the environment that lead to a sustainable society. Even more, it helps people connect deeply with each other, their communities, and the natural world.

Given the unprecedented challenges we face as a global society—from climat change and biodiversity loss to decreasing access to nature and a growing gap between the rich and poor—there has never been a more important time to scale up our environmental education efforts. Global leaders must make better use of education and capacity-building as strategies to improve the environment, along with tools of governance, regulation, economic and community incentives, and technology.

The Global Environmental Education Partnership (GEEP) is focused on building capacity for environmental education and sustainability around the world and using the power of education to help address global environmenta and social problems. Its advisors are made up of researchers, policymakers, education practitioners, and others who represent government and non-governmental sectors from more than 20 countries and regions.

The GEEP believes that national and international professional networks are essential to ensuring the quality of education in, about, and for the environment. These networks need support from a wide range of stakeholders. As a network of networks, GEEP brings together partners who are committed to helping global citizens address environmental and social challenges by developing and strengthening environmental education worldwide.

This **Call for Action** is asking the international environmental education community to take stock of where we are as field and think ahead to the future. It includes ten draft actions, crafted with input from GEEP leaders from around the world, and is designed to get input from educators working in this field about our key priorities for the next decap.

A Call to Action

Supports GEEP Goals 1 & 4

In 2017, GEEP mobilized the global community around a call for action to strengthen environmental education. The goal of the Call to Action campaign was to recommit to the importance of EE and to work with professionals around the world to identify key actions that will help advance our work. We asked individuals and organizations to sign a pledge and vote on the actions they felt were most important to strengthening environmental education. We highlighted organizations who have committed to signing the Call to Action pledge on the GEEP website, NAAEE social media channels, and through the GEEP newsletter. We also created a badge on our website to showcase organizations that have signed the pledge, publicly recognizing their commitment to EE.

Currently, more than 500 individuals and more than 70 organizations representing more than 150 countries have adopted the GEEP pledge, including organizations such as Earth Day Network, National Wildlife Federation, WWF-Finland, FEE Korea, Eco-Schools USA, and FEE Malta. More than 20,000 people watched the video and reviewed the materials.

In the past decade, the GEEP has been a source of information, resources, ideas, and support to educators everywhere. Our Advisors, colleagues, and partners have served as ambassadors of environmental education, helping to support the work of the GEEP and the importance for environmental education, climate change education, sustainability, and more. Here's a sample of events that members of the GEEP were involved with:

- GEEP hosted an event in conjunction with COP26 in Glasgow, Scotland (2021). This event featured speakers from Taiwan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, EPA Taiwan, U.S. EPA, Taipei Representative Office in the U.K., and several private sector leaders representing TEEMA, AmCham, and KPMG. This event included GEEP Advisors and EE 30 Under 30 awardees from Africa and Northern Ireland.
- GEEP presented at the 2021 Sustainability Research and Innovation
 Congress to discuss the role of EE in achieving the SDGs and the 2021
 International Congress for Conservation Biology through the Society for
 Conservation Biology.
- GEEP Advisors Alan Reid and Kartikeya Sarabhai presented briefly on the GEEP during the UN Climate Change Conference in Bonn, Germany (2017).
- GEEP presented at the Eye on Earth Symposium in Dubai, UAE (2018).
- GEEP has also engaged with the World Bank's Connect4Climate initiative, as well as Canada Green Corps / UN Association in Canada, the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP), and the UN Development Programme (UNDP) through meetings to assess areas for collaboration.
- GEEP has also presented at a number of other gatherings, including several
 presentations at the UNEA Conference in Nairobi, the World Environmental
 Education Congress (WEEC), including a coordinating role for WEEC's Youth
 Congress, and other gatherings throughout the world.

The events and presentations mentioned above have an estimated cumulative reach of over 400.

From safeguarding the endangered dusky langur in Malaysia to establishing a marine education network and confronting climate change across India, these case studies highlight effective strategies and programs flourishing in diverse landscapes, disciplines, and sectors.

Each story not only celebrates successes but also candidly addresses the challenges educators encounter while tackling pressing environmental and social issues faced by communities worldwide. The collaborative process of crafting these case studies is also a rich learning journey, empowering educators to share and replicate impactful practices.

These stories are used to enhance professional development workshops and online seminars, infusing authenticity into university and secondary education. They also provide engaging insights into topics as varied as economics, public health, and environmental justice, making learning both relevant and inspiring.

The GEEP currently has 25 case studies that highlight diverse, effective environmental education practices from around the world. Five of these case studies are translated into Mandarin. In recent years, GEEP case studies have annually received more than 5,000 page views and 500 PDF downloads.

A New e-Book: Using Case Studies to Advance Learning


Supports GEEP Goals 1 & 2

The GEEP e-book, Environmental Education in Action–Learning from Case Studies Around the World, highlights central themes in environmental education and connects to the case study collection and the SDGs. The overall goal of the e-book is to showcase how case studies can advance learning and provide insights and activities to help university and secondary educators integrate environmental education into their teaching. It also provides ideas for how educators can develop their own case studies to create relevant and engaging content for learners.

Goals of the e-book:

- improve understanding of EE by reviewing topics and case studies that demonstrate cutting-edge ideas in this field
- foster critical thinking among educators by reflecting on and discussing EE topics and case studies, and
- help educators improve their own practice

In recent years, the e-book webpage has annually received approximately 1,000 views and 150 chapter downloads.


Country Profiles

This initiative, powered by the collective enthusiasm of our GEEP Advisory Group and amplified through NAAEE's social media channels, our website, and newsletter, has helped us weave an even richer tapestry of global environmental education. Our goal is to profile every country and hope that our colleagues will contribute by writing new profiles for their countries and updating existing profiles.

These profiles offer educators, policymakers, and environmentalists a unique opportunity to learn from what others are doing and collaborate across borders. You can see which countries have environmental education policies and associations, with links to key resources from each country. As the collection continues to grow, so does our ability to share knowledge, spark ideas, and foster a truly global community dedicated to environmental education.

Strengthening EE in Your Country: A Discussion Guide

Supports All GEEP Goals

A key goal of GEEP is to spur collaboration and strengthen EE at the country and regional level, looking at everything from effective policies, practices, professional development, and more. In 2021, a session at the Asia Pacific Virtual EE Forum provided ideas and insights into what might be helpful as people are working to accelerate their work in environmental education and sustainability. Over the course of the next several years, with input from Advisors and other colleagues, the GEEP created a new resource, Strengthening EE in Your Country: A Discussion Guide. The guide helps professionals advance EE in their country by giving them the tools to discuss and reflect on the status of EE at national and regional levels and identify areas to improve. The guide is structured around key elements of a



strong national EE program, including structure, programs, quality assurance, funding, and guidance for planning next steps. It encourages conversations by posing questions such as:

- What does a strong environmental education program in a country or region look like?
- How does a strong program link to the UN Sustainable Development Goals?
- What needs to be in place to ensure that people of all ages have opportunities to develop the awareness, knowledge, skills, and motivations to tackle the environmental and social issues we face as a global society?
- What policies currently exist to support environmental education and where are the gaps?
- How does EE change our society, its values, and broader systems (such as economic, political, and educational) that shape our interactions with the environment?
